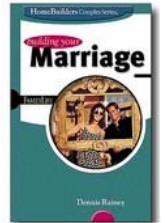

What is an "Annual Conference"?



From Pastor Kelly

Elsewhere in this newsletter you will read about the Kentucky Annual Conference which is coming to Northern Kentucky the first week in June. We are strongly encouraging people from our church to serve in some volunteer role or to attend one or more of the services or sessions being offered.

However, if you are not a long-time Methodist you may have no idea what we are even talking about.

An Annual Conference is a regional organizational unit of the United Methodist Church and the regular yearly business meeting of that unit. It is presided over by the Bishop assigned to the conference. Our Bishop is Lindsay Davis who presides over the Kentucky Conference of the UMC.

The Annual Conference is composed of an equal number of clergy and laity. Each charge conference elects as many lay delegates as they have clergy appointed to that church or charge.

The Annual Conference is responsible for accepting goals and approving the budget for the work of the United Methodist Church in its area. It is also responsible for approving persons for ordinations as clergy and performing the ceremonies required. At the end of every Annual Conference the presiding Bishop fixes / reads the appointments of all clergy for the coming conference year.

The Annual Conference is a time to review ministry activities in the previous year, adopt policies, manage structures and financial issues, vote on constitutional amendments, and to develop plans and policies which will strengthen the spiritual life and mission of the church. It is also a time of revival and spiritual renewal for all involved. In our case about 2500 committed Christians and church leaders will gather here for inspiring services and Bible studies, prayer, mutual encouragement and accountability, and worshipful work.

Please pray particularly for all Annual Conference gatherings as they vote on several constitutional amendments affecting our entire denomination. For more information about those amendments go to KYMC.org and click on the Annual Conference link.

Please pray also for our lay and clergy delegates: Don Beckett, Anne Dennis, Tom Keuper, Chuck Kuhlman, Kelly McClendon, Steve Pescosolido, Susan Eaton, and Ken Easley. Alternate delegates: Roy Cotcamp and Sally Zeidler. Betty Minor and Jere McIntyre also are involved in hosting / oversight duties and volunteer recruitment. Any of these persons would be glad to speak with you about the work of the Annual Conference.

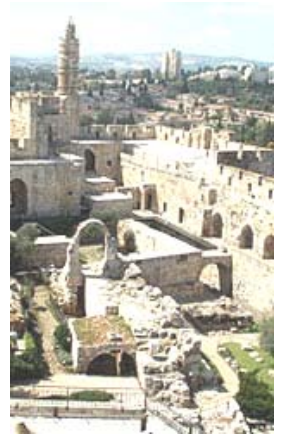
